

All 9-Ball rules and bylaws will apply.

Team fee is \$16

Match format: One doubles match 8-Ball, then the 2 highest skill levels will play a singles match 9-Ball, then the two lower skill levels play a singles match 9-Ball, then one more Scotch Doubles match 9-Ball for a total of four matches played per night. Both formats will use the 9-Ball skill levels. The 8-Ball Doubles match will be a game race to 9-Ball handicap rather than points race. *If the skill levels on one team are equal, that team may decide which player plays the higher handicap player, with the remaining player playing the lower handicapped player. If the skill levels are the same on both teams, the team that loses the first Scotch Doubles match must put up first.*

Skill level for doubles: Combine your two 9-Ball handicaps, then divide by two and round down if necessary. eg. $4 + 5 = 9$ $9 / 2 = 4.5$, drop the $1/2$ and play as a 4 in doubles.

Points: First doubles match and the two singles matches are worth 1 point each. The final doubles match is worth 2 points for a total of 5 points per night.

Three points will be awarded for a bye or a complete forfeit.

Lag for break. The winning player of the lag decides whether to break or rack. The loser of the lag must shoot next.

Alternate shots. The player who makes the 9-Ball breaks next rack. The losing team must continue the same rotation.

One time out per team, per game.

Teams can consist of any combination of two players; they do not have to be male/female.

Substitutes are allowed. Substitute must be rated no higher than the player they are substituting for in both 8-Ball AND 9-Ball. Make-up matches are allowed if the opponent is notified 24 hours in advance. One week from original match time is allowed to make up the match. **NO MAKE UP MATCHES ALLOWED IN LAST THREE WEEKS OF SESSION.** These may be made up in advance.

No new players- all players must have ten 9-Ball matches in regular league play.

Suggested skill level is 10. You may start out no higher than 11. If you are raised to a 12, you still may finish out the session. You can still win the trip to Vegas at any skill level. However, in order to qualify for the Nationals Scotch Doubles in Vegas, your team can not be handicapped higher than 10.

Standard 9-Ball must win chart will be used.

Split tables for singles required if a second table is available.

End of session ties are the same as regular league.

Play-offs are the same as regular session

Mid-year tournaments such as Tri-cup or Money Cup will be determined later.

City Tournament: Only one doubles match will be played each round (no singles matches). This is the same format in Vegas.
